Worship Notes for September

We are a liturgical church. This means we go by the liturgical calendar, we have paraments which change color with liturgical time, and we celebrate some special Sundays. Check out the calendar on the back to see how this works. This calendar is for the year 2023 but the liturgical year starts with the first Sunday in Advent which often falls at the end of November but this year will be December 3.

(Count four Sundays back from Christmas.) The last Sunday of the liturgical year is Christ the King Sunday. Notice the parament colors: white, purple, red, green.

Currently we are in Ordinary Time with September 3rd being the 14th Sunday after Pentecost. You may think that during "ordinary" time, nothing much is happening. Ordinary is used here (like ordinal) to mean counting. Sunday, September 3rd, is the 14th Sunday after Epiphany. There are 33-34 weeks total of ordinary time occurring in two periods - between Epiphany and Lent and between Easter and the end of the liturgical year leading to Advent. It is a time of growth as we celebrate and study the life and teachings of Jesus Christ and what it means to be a disciple.

Maybe this should be 'ordinary' for Christians.

After the first Sunday in September when we have Communion and use white paraments, you will notice a special green cloth on the table. You will notice it is covered in hands - the hands used for service, giving, playing, hugging, and praying. This cloth with its batik design was on the table at the Montreat Music and Worship Conference in 2021. When you see this cloth, look at your own hands and imagine them doing the work of Christ in your ordinary, daily life.
