

Dear FPC Members & Friends,

One of the most important words in the Bible occurs 240 times in the Old Testament. It provides the foundation for our relationship with God and also directs our daily living.

The Hebrew word "hesed" is most often translated "steadfast love." Throughout the scriptures of the Old and New Testaments, God promises to love us with everlasting, neverending, steadfast love.

The prophet Isaiah uses poetic imagery to describe the permanence of God's love: mountains may disappear, and hills may become level ground, but God's "hesed" will never be taken away from God's people (Isaiah 54:10).

All human beings sometimes get lost. We go off course or make wrong turns. But God's love is always waiting for us to come back. "Return to the Lord, your God, for he is gracious and merciful ... abounding in steadfast love ... (Joel 2:13)"

"God is good, all the time ... all the time, God is good," a traditional call and response often used during Christian worship, echoes God's "hesed" that is celebrated in Psalm 100:5

For the Lord is good;

His steadfast love endures forever,

And his faithfulness to all generations.

During FPC's 194 years as a Church Family, there have been many changes in the City of Athens, Limestone County, and throughout the world. One thing that has not changed is the foundation of FPC's life, faith, and ministry. From generation to generation, our congregation continues to pass along the unchanging truth of God's steadfast love in Jesus Christ.

In his dedication of the Temple in 1 Kings 8:23, King Solomon prayed: O Lord, God of Israel, there is no God like you

In heaven above or on earth beneath, keeping covenant and steadfast love for your servants who walk before you with all their heart..."




Attention FPC Children and Youth: Join us for SHINE
